Graduate School of Human Interaction and Growth (GHIG)

- Collaborates closely with the Department of Health Promotion and Development (HEMIL) and the Department of Psychosocial Sciences.
- Aim of GHIG:
The graduate school focuses on social and psychological change processes within fields such as organizational psychology and leadership, school development and learning, and health promotion and preventive initiatives.



GHIG offers elective courses and social activities

- About 4 elective courses (within methods, perspective and research ethics) per year. (9-10 ECTs per year).
- Short seminars which are held every month organized by 2 PhD candidates.
- Mid-term evaluation of PhD candidates at their 4th semester.
- PhD course and staff seminar at Gran Canaria every 2nd year (next 2017)
- Courses are primarily for GHIG members but others can participate on availability.



GHIG: who ? How many?

- GHIG organizes about 33 PhD students from 10 research groups, and 25-30 faculty staff.
- PhD candidates belong to GHIG if their supervisor or research group is a member of GHIG.
