#### How it began ...

 IGSIN was founded in 2005 and started as Research School with stipends from Trier, Greifswald, and Bergen







### IGSIN today

- IGSIN is a joint venture of the Faculty of Psychology and the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry
- IGSIN has ~20 students from the faculty of psychology and ~20 students from the faculty of medicine and dentistry
- Students have different research areas, ranging from basic neuroscience, genetics, and anatomy, to animal models, functional imaging, and clinical research




## IGSIN today




#### Where are IGSIN students and lab facilities located?






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


- 2<sup>nd</sup> 7<sup>th</sup> floor: Biomedicine
  - **→** Basic neuroscience, Animal lab, neuroanatomy
- 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> floor: Psychology
  - Neuropsychology, cognitive neuroscience, animal lab, EEG-labs, TMS, etc.





- Department of clinical science (K1)
- Genetics





- Department of Radiology → (f)MR facilities
- Department of Neurology
- Other departments & disciplines (e.g. Audiology, etc.)





- IGSIN offers each fall a course in integrated neuroscience that attempts to cover a broad spectrum of topics:
  - 2 weeks with lectures from basic neuroscience to clinical research
  - Lab demonstrations:
    - Brain dissection
    - Animal lab visit
    - Hands-on EEG and fMRI demonstration
  - Evaluation: Essay → 6 ECTS



- Annual courses in functional imaging
  - 1 week course with lectures and hands-on training
  - Course is supported by NRSN & MedIm
  - Evaluation: Essay → 3ECTS





- Weekly lab meetings
- From 2016 (?): A one week course on "Sleep and circadian rhythms"
- Other courses "on demand", i.e. not regularly offered (Plans for 2016: Analysis of longitudinal studies)
